Mohamad Shaboot is a Government relations and business development expert, specializes in engagement with the Government of IRAQ. Recipient of numerous commendations. While performing his duties in managing political and economic issues, Mohamad engages the Government of Iraq at the highest level, in his career he led executive-level operations within both the public and private sectors.

In 2005, he joined the diplomatic staff at the Iraqi ministry of foreign affairs. Later that year, he was posted to the Iraqi Embassy in Amman in Jordan, where he served as a political officer handling bilateral, multilateral as well as consular issues.

In 2009 he was re-posted to MOFA in Baghdad to serve as a political officer at the department of Europe where he handled bilateral political and economic issues.

In 2011 Mohamad Joined GE's Global Growth & Operations team as government affairs & policy lead for Iraq, his focus was supporting GE's business interest with the government of Iraq. he supported growth and expansion plans through networking with various Iraqi ministries & government institutions on both federal and provincial levels.

In January 2013 he rejoined the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and was posted to the Permanent Mission to the United Nations in New York and named Advisor to the team mitigating IRAQ's sanctions under chapter VII at UN Security Council.

In January 2017 he was re-assigned to the Iraqi Embassy in DC where he was named Director of Economic desk and Handled the engagement with both government and US private sector, he Led and executed strategy to strengthen the relationship with the private sector including US Multinational Corporations, the US Chamber of Commerce, Department of Trade, US Development Agencies, and Foreign Commercial offices, as well as the relationship with the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for the Iraq standby arrangement, economic reforms, and Iraq budget issues. Mohamad was also named the Government of Iraq's Focal point at the Embassy for the Iraq reconstruction conference in Kuwait.

In 2018, Mohamad Shaboot was re-posted to Iraqi MOFA in Baghdad, where is currently advising on sustainable development issues at the Department of International organizations.

Mr. Shaboot received his Bachelor Degree in Electronics Engineering from Northrop University in 1987. Born and raised in Baghdad, Mr. Shaboot is married to Ayser Najjar and has three daughters, they live in the US while his duties require of him to be in Iraq. Prior to joining the Iraqi Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mohamad held the position of Iraq director of operation for VOEX International.
